The initial appointment for a full-time position would be for one year with possibility of renewal. The Legal Studies Program is an interdisciplinary program that seeks to integrate specific institutional concerns with the disciplinary contributions of such fields as Politics, Philosophy, Economics, Anthropology, Sociology, Psychology, Women's Studies, Literature, Natural Resources, and History. The area of specialization is open, although we are particularly interested in comparative and international law, human rights, legal theory, race and gender and the law, environmental law, and law and society. Preference will be given to candidates who can combine broader conceptual and theoretical concerns with specific legal problems.

SALARY: \$4,791 - \$8,265 per course, commensurate with qualifications and experience.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS: J.D. (or equivalent) and/or Ph.D. or Advancement to Candidacy in Political Science or related field is required at time of appointment. Previous teaching experience highly desirable. Applicants should have a demonstrated interest in interdisciplinary law-related issues and training in both law and a relevant liberal arts discipline.
