The [Feminist Studies Department](#) at the University of California, Santa Cruz, invites applications for a three-year pool of qualified temporary instructors beginning in the Fall Quarter to teach upper-division courses in the following areas: Feminist Theories; Racial and Gender Formations in the US; Women's Literature; Transnational Feminism; Postcolonial Feminist Studies; Chicana Feminism; Feminist Perspectives on Science, Health, and Reproductive Issues; Women and the Environment; Feminist Psychology; Women and Popular Culture; and Jewish Women's Studies. Course proposals should encompass issues of multiculturalism, race, and class. The campus is especially interested in candidates who can contribute to the diversity and excellence of the academic community through their research, teaching, and/or service.

Candidates accepted into this pool may be approached by other units to teach in areas related to their demonstrated areas of expertise.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS: M.A.; Ph.D. preferred in an appropriate field. Willingness to teach both seminars and large lecture courses. Minimum 3-5 years teaching experience preferred.

SALARY: \$5,000 and upwards per course with Ph.D., commensurate with qualifications and experience.
