Enhancement courses (Social Justice and Community)

Cowell College at the University of California, Santa Cruz (UCSC) invites applications for the position of Lecturer for Cowell Enhancement Courses. Enhancement courses operate under the general direction of the Cowell provost and are meant to augment or enhance general education requirements and disciplinary courses. These courses, designed and taught by the lecturer, offer students the opportunity for small, seminar-style classes at the college level. Applicants should be able to contribute to Cowell College's emphasis on social justice and community. Although trained in one discipline, applicants should be comfortable working in an interdisciplinary environment. Possible related areas of research and teaching might include the humanities, arts, social sciences or physical sciences. The successful candidate will be expected to design and/or teach one or more Enhancement courses. The Enhancement courses run alongside Cowell's Core Curriculum, which focuses on social justice, community outreach, and composition instruction.

RANK: Lecturer

SALARY: Commensurate with qualifications, experience, and number of course units taught per quarter.

BASIC QUALIFICATIONS: Ph.D. in hand at time of application; a demonstrated record of teaching in higher education; demonstrated record of teaching seminar-style classes within the last three (3) years; experience designing and teaching interdisciplinary courses.

PREFERRED QUALIFICATIONS: Familiarity/experience with the Cowell Core course themes and texts; experience teaching rhetoric and composition; experience teaching Core at UCSC or equivalent at another institution of higher education. Core courses are general education courses that help develop critical thinking and writing skills necessary for success in university study.

POSITION AVAILABLE: As openings occur, contingent upon availability of funding.

TO APPLY: Applications are accepted via the UCSC Academic Recruit online system, and must include a C.V., a letter of interest that addresses how you meet the basic and preferred qualifications, three sets of recent (3 years or less) teaching evaluations, two letters of reference*, and a sample syllabus for a 10-week long proposed course you would teach that addresses social justice. Documents/materials must be submitted as PDF files.
