RANK: Lecturer

BASIC QUALIFICATIONS: M.A. or equivalent foreign degree in Sociology or related field.

PREFERRED QUALIFICATIONS: Ph.D. in Sociology or related field. Evidence of teaching or demonstrated potential for University level teaching at the undergraduate level.

POSITION AVAILABLE: As openings occur, appointments contingent upon availability of funding.
