Lecturers will teach established or new courses to aid Kresge's mission of enriching the academic life of its students and preparing them for academic success. Applicants should be able to contribute to one or more of the following subject areas: Arts, Engineering, Humanities, Physical and Biological Sciences, and Social Sciences. Kresge especially encourages course proposals involving hands-on learning, practical, participatory pedagogy, service learning, and interdisciplinarity. Candidates who can contribute to the diversity and excellence of Kresge College are encouraged to apply.

RANK: Lecturer

SALARY: Commensurate with qualifications, experience, and number of course units taught per quarter.

BASIC QUALIFICATIONS: Master's Degree or demonstrated experience such as a record of creative work, publication, exhibition, or performance record.

PREFERRED QUALIFICATIONS: Ph.D., university level teaching experience and experience teaching first-year university students is desirable.

POSITION AVAILABLE: As openings occur, for single courses, contingent upon availability of funding.

TO APPLY: Applications are accepted via the UCSC Academic Recruit online system, and must include a brief cover letter; an up-to-date curriculum vitae; three current letters of recommendation*; and teaching evaluations for a course taught within the past three years, if available; sample of publications, exhibit and/or performance materials, if available (please include in a pdf or link to website); and up to three syllabi (optional). These materials must be submitted as PDF files.
