The campus is especially interested in candidates who can contribute to the diversity and excellence of the academic community through their teaching and other assigned duties, and who have experience teaching academic English skills to international and domestic learners of English. Candidates are expected to have native or near-native proficiency in English. Candidates are also expected to have extensive training in language pedagogy.

RANK: Lecturer.

SALARY: Commensurate with qualifications and experience.

BASIC QUALIFICATIONS: Master's degree in English, TESOL, Applied Linguistics or related field and one year of independent teaching of English for Academic Purposes to non-native English speakers at the university level.

POSITION AVAILABLE: As openings occur, contingent upon availability of funding.

TO APPLY: Applications are accepted via the UCSC Academic Recruit online system, and must include a letter of application that addresses how the basic qualifications are met; curriculum vitae; three confidential letters of recommendation*; and a sample course syllabus. Applicants are invited to submit copies of student evaluations (a maximum of three sets will be accepted). Documents/materials must be submitted as PDF files.
